- Mary raised the issue of revisions to the GTAC Bylaws. We had discussed
  whether there is a need for amendments at the January Board meeting. The
  Petosky Regional Audubon Society recently amended their bylaws which added
  some provisions that took into account situations that arose because of the
  pandemic.
- Mary agreed to draft some proposed revisions for the Board to review.

- Fall: Detroit Audubon : Bike and Brews on Leelanau Trail to Suttons Bay

## **Liaison with Michigan Audubon Society: John Mesch**

Nothing new to report

#### Old Business:

- Blue Bird Houses:
  - This project will be done in 2023.
  - Plan: Put this on the July agenda so that we can plan and seek volunteers to do some of the cutting of the bird house patterns etc.
  - Discussion in July: We still need to flesh out our goals?
    - Goals? : Having kids/parents and adults build for their use? Do we want a good will donation to cover some or all of the cost? Replace boxes on Leelanau? Around Nature Center? New locations?
    - Who will lead the project?
    - Cost of materials: Jerry has a ballpark figure for lumber. \$180 for 25 boxes. Who would lead the construction of the boxes?
    - Partner with Bluebird Society? What are their requirements?
      - We didn't really answer this question.
- Internship for Evan Reister: Perhaps Even would like a project to place, monitor and maintain Blue Bird boxes in an area near his home?
  - Kirk indicated that Evan is busy and is likely more in need of work to save for college. Not pursuing this.
- Discussion of plan for approaching GT County Parks and Rec regarding a mobility dock at Medalie Park
  - Kirk reported that he has been watching the progress of the new bridge over the Boardman River. He will eventually go out and measure the grade to see if it would be accessible for those who may be mobility limited. The new bridge may be a viewing platform of sorts.
  - The idea of the platform at Medalie is still viable but we need to see how it may fit with the new bridge. It may be a great opportunity for folks who could not access the bridge.
- Gourd Purple Martin House System at Grielickville Park.
  - This piece of the Purple Martin House is on hold given that we may have another opportunity for a PM House at the Historic Barns at the Commons.

Do we have sufficient volunteers to manage this project?

- Kirk reported that has been contacted by the folks at the Barns. They have a Purple Martin House that they would like us to take care of. Kirk does have three or four folks that have volunteered to help. He will do more promotion in the May newsletter.
- The Petosky Area Audubon Society has a YouTube video that they showed at their latest meeting. <a href="https://youtu.be/-p2W-upwJBg">https://youtu.be/-p2W-upwJBg</a>
- Sharon Benjey knows a gentleman in her area that did a lot of research to put up Purple Martin Houses in his yard. This sounds like an interesting story.
   Sharon will interview him for the May newsletter and send a short article to Kirk.

- 2023 GTAC Bird Calendar: Do we want to pursue this project or table it?
  - We really didn't conclude on this project.
- Kirk raised the question as to whether, in addition to Bluebird houses, would this
  be an opportunity to build some houses for other species? Owls, why isn't there
  a duck box on the Boardman? We could sell them for a small profit for fund
  raising.
  - There was some discussion. We are going to stick with the Bluebird Houses for now. This idea may come up in the July meeting when we discuss Bluebird Houses and plan for this project.

## **New Business:**

- Bluebird House at the Barns: Kathy Flegel: See Kirk's report
- Boardman River Clean Up: Donation \$100 need to advise them and send letter if we intend to support this.
  - The board did discuss this and agreed to send a \$100 donation to the Boardman River Clean Up funding it from the Walter Hastings Fund. Under the Bylaws, the Board has the discretion to utilize the WHF.
  - A letter of support will also be sent.

MOTION: Motion by Mary MacDowell seconded by Kirk Waterstripe to support the Boardman River Clean Up in the amount of \$100 to be funded by the Walter Hastings Fund and to send a letter of support in the name of GTAC. All approved.
